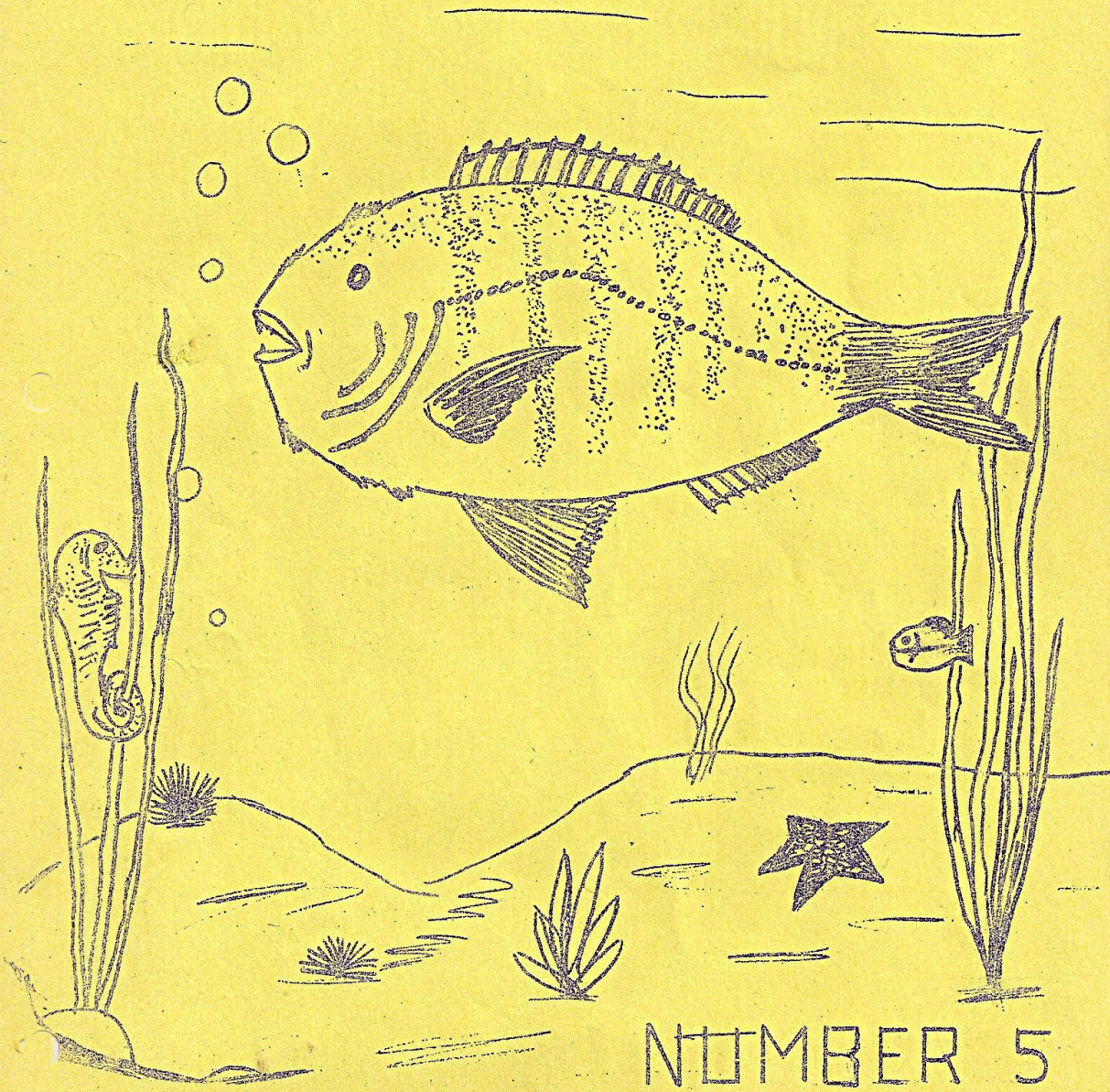

And I had the room watch - they all depended on me

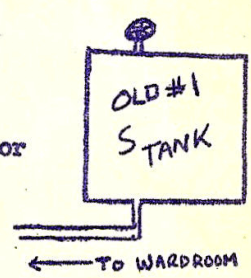
Suddenly the boat took a five degree up bubble

1 JUL 66 - SARGO was awarded her third NUC at PHNSY. The Secretary of the Navy commended SARGO for Exceptionally Meritorious Service as a member of the Submarine Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet, while conducting related operations during 1963, 1964 and 1965, USS SARGO demonstrated outstanding performance throughout these periods. As a result of this commendation SARGO became the first ship in the Navy to receive a third award of the coveted Navy Unit Commendation.

We came across the launching prayer that was said at the launching ceremonies for the USS SARGO. It carried quite a message then and we thought you might appreciate reading it again.....

LAUNCHING PRAYER FOR USS SARGO
16 October 1957

Eternal Father, strong to save, whose arm doth bind the restless wave,
We would invoke thy divine blessing upon this occasion of launching the
USS SARGO. May we see in this momentous event, not only an addition to
our country's Naval powers but a determination to fulfil our responsibilities
in preserving our heritage and in maintaining freedom and justice for all
mankind.

We marvel, O God, at the glories of thy handwork and we are grateful that
thou hast seen fit to make man in thine own image -- that thou has given him
a mind with which to think and create. As we look at this boat about to be
launched may we see not only iron and steel, machinery and fine instruments,
nuclear power guided missiles, but also an application of thy gifts to man.

Little by little thou hast opened to us new channels of wisdom and power.
We can go through the seas like fish and through the skies like birds. Thou
hast enabled us to tap new resources whereby our energies are unlimited.
Great God of life, in the great strides we are taking may we never lose
sight of our dependence upon thee-- May we never fail thee in our basic gift
of being thy children--, men able to walk upon the earth.

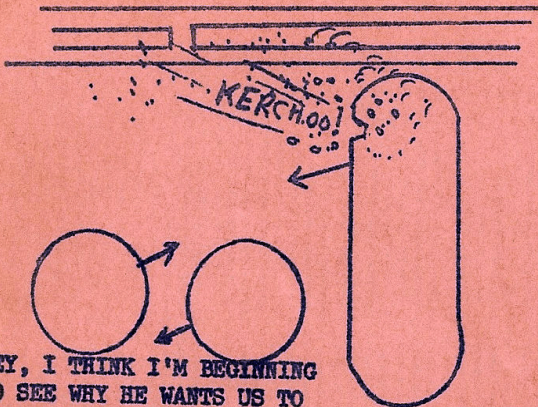
We would pray, O God, that the wisdom which has made possible the building

This we would ask in his name. Amen.

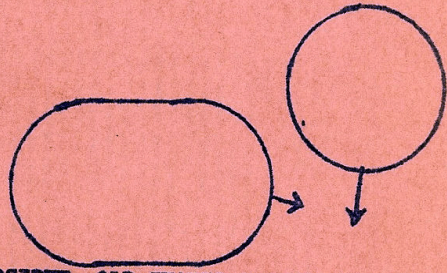
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THE FIRST SARGO - -

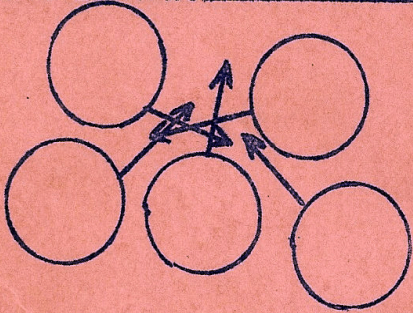
SARGO is the second submarine to be so named in the Navy. The first
SARGO was built by the Electric Boat Company, Groton, Connecticut and was
commissioned November 7, 1939. It was in Philippine waters on December 7,
1941 and made it's first attack with torpedoes 7 days later. In it's
several patrols, the earlier SARGO sank 7 enemy vessels for a total of
32,000 tons. Following "VJ" Day she was stricken from the Navy Register
and scrapped.



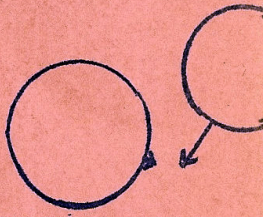

SOME HIGHLIGHTS OF EARLY SHIP'S HISTORY

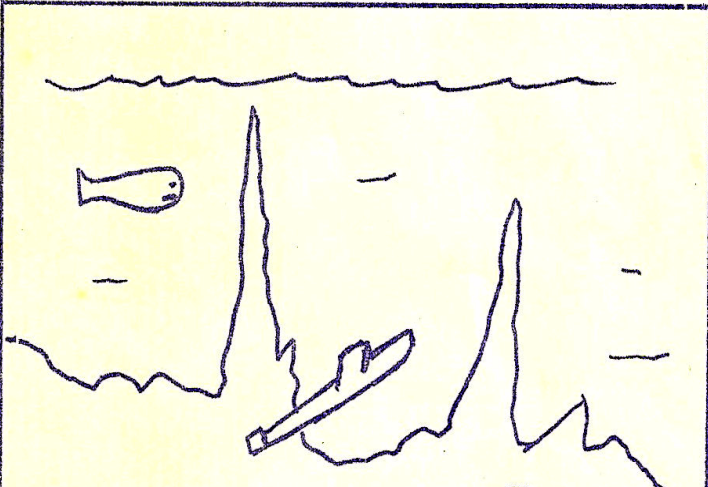
- 1 OCT 58: SARGO was commissioned at Mare Island Naval Shipyard. The first CO was CDR Daniel P. BROOKS. SARGO was the first nuclear ship to be built on the west coast and the fifth in the United States.
- JAN-MAR 59 - SARGO conducted extensive shakedown cruise of 19,000 miles of Pacific Ocean before arriving at Pearl. During cruise SARGO made one dive of 44 days, 33 of which were divorced from the earth's atmosphere - a record for the SKATE class submarine. During this cruise SARGO became the first nuclear submarine to cross the equator.
- 1 OCT 59 - CDR BROOKS relieved by CDR NICHOLSON as CO. CDR BROOKS awarded the Legion of Merit.
- JAN-FEB 60 - Winter arctic cruise through Bearing and Chuckchi Seas to the North Pole and return. Logged 11,136 miles, 6003 under the ice, and all but 300 miles submerged. Proved the possibility of year round access to the Arctic Basin from either Atlantic or Pacific.
- 3 MAR 60 - Back at Pearl Harbor CDR NICHOLSON awarded Legion of Merit and crew awarded the First Navy Unit Commendation.
- 14 JUN 60 - Fire and explosion in stern room while charging oxygen banks from the shore. Entire stern room gutted by fire necessitating submergence of the after end of boat to extinguish blaze. One crew member lost his life during fire.
- 8-13 MAY 64 - Visited Sydney Australia for 19 Annual Coral Sea Celebration.
- 4 OCT 61 - Awarded E for Battle Efficiency.
- 9 DEC 61 - LCDR EARLY awarded a CINCPACFLT Commendation for his performance as CO.
- 30 JUN 62 - Awarded E 2nd year in a row.
- 28 JUL 62 - Entered PHNSY for overhaul and refueling. SARGO was the 1st Submarine to be refuel at PHNSY.
- 24 SEP 62 - Awarded the Marjorie Sterrett Battleship Fund award for FY 1962.
- 17 NOV 62 - LCDR EARLY received the Legion of Merit and crewmembers received the 2nd Navy Unit Commendation for Exceptionally Meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services.


Dear Scabby:

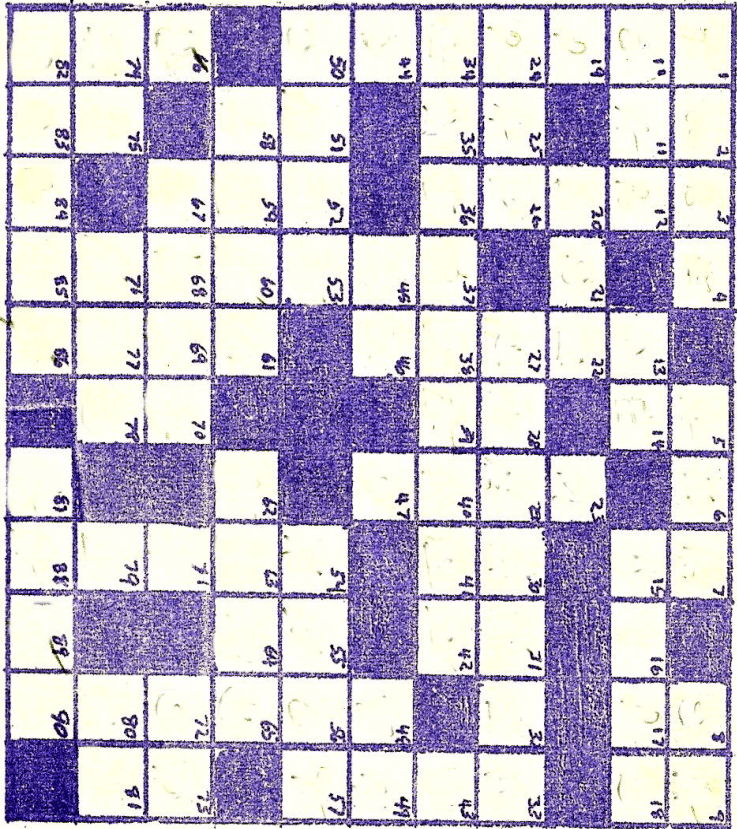

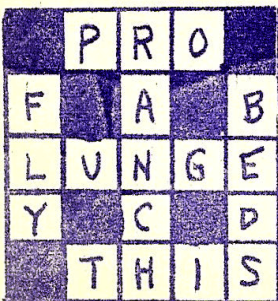
