Try Conti, or Nelson, Phillips or Seapig

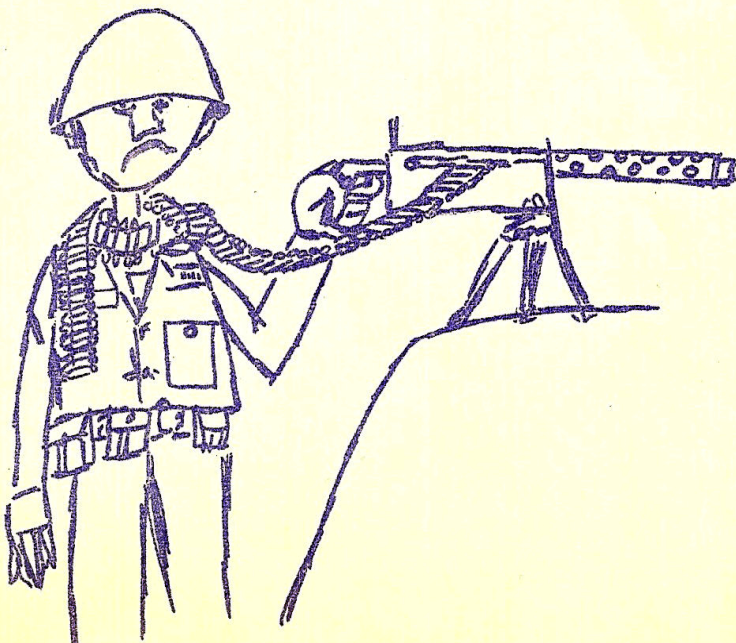
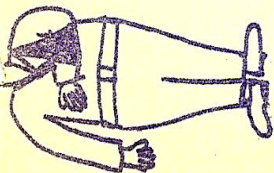
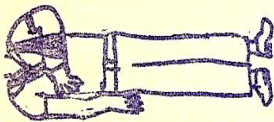

A SHORT DIVE INTO THE HISTORY OF SUBMARINES

In the third century, B.C. Archimedes discovered the laws of floating bodies, and event which might be considered the inventions of submarines. It was Aledander the Great who was the first man on record to go below the surface of the water in a boat of any type. It is said he had himself lowered into the sea in a glass barrel.

Leonardo da Vinci also experimented with the idea of a submarine as did many of his contemporaries.

Cornelis Drebbel, a Dutch inventor, is credited with building the first submarine. His craft, built in 1620, consisted of a wooden frame covered with greased leather. Oars sealed with water tight flaps provided the propulsion.

In 1747 an unidentified inventor introduced a method of submerging and surfacing his submarine by having a number of goatskins built into the hull and attached to an aperture in the bottom of the boat. To submerge, the skins were to be filled with water. To surface, the skins were twisted with a rod, forcing the water out. Thus, the first ballast tank.

During the American Revolution a Yale student by the name of David Bushnell built a submarine to use with the underwater gunpowder he had developed. One man alone had to crank one of the two screws and managed the pumps, valves and changes of ballast.

Some twenty years after Bushnell, Robert Fulton built the Nautilus, which was a submarine with a sail for surface operation and a hand turned screw for use when submerged. Fulton conceived the ideas of vertical and horizontal rudders, ballast tanks and compressed air for replacing foul air. These ideas were incorporated in our modern submarines.

During the Civil War, the Confederate forces built a submarine named CSS H.L. HUNLEY. This submarine was propelled by eight men turning hand cranks. Armed with a torpedo at the end of a fifteen foot pole the HUNLEY sank a Union ship in 1864. She never returned from her mission.

From 1864 to 1872 the Navy experimented with a submarine called the Intelligent Whale. She flooded on her first trial, ending any further attempts.

With the development of electrical machinery, an all electric submarine was built in 1886 by Wolseley and Lyon of England. Its speed was six knots and it was powered by two 50-hp electric motors and a 100-cell storage battery. It had a range of only 80 miles.

In 1895, John Phillip Holland was contracted to build the submarine PLUNGER for the U.S. Navy. Forseeing her failure because of naval restrictions, he began building another entirely from his own plans which was called USS HOLLAND. This was truly the first successful submarine of the United States Navy and was delivered in 1900 to become the basic design for all submarines to follow. Holland was propelled on the surface by a 50-hp gasoline engine and had an electric motor, run by a large storage battery for underwater power. Her speed was eight knots on the surface and five and a half when submerged. She carried a crew of five men and one officer. Then somebody dreamed up the idea of qualification and it's been going on ever since.

- 31 JUL: The twist in this one is that a non-secret type secret agent is accidently mistaken for a secret-type secret agent and James Garner (the non-secret type secret agent) gets involved with smugglers, spys, bombs and other intricate things like Melina (how sweet it is) Mercuri in A MAN COULD GET KILLED. Tony Franciosa helps.
- 1 AUG: The great Nose is back with his coheart and side kicker and part time scarecrow Phyllis Diller and this time Bob's a widower with a housefull of assorted rugrats and a huge dog type animal. The sweet things are Shirley Eaton and Jill (jobble, gobble) St. John. Lamar Gene (Jonathon Winters) socks it to them in EIGHT ON THE LAM.
- 2 AUG: Ray Danton, Leigh Snowden and a cast of dozens help to make the spectactlar production of OUTSIDE THE LAW, filmed in glorious black and drabby white and in full standard size a flop. The only good thing about this one is that you get to see some counterfit \$20 bills. The cartoon, entitled Plastered in Paris is probably very funny.
- 3 AUG: The trails lead to London, Paris and Rome and across Anita (Whopee) Ekberg and Trevor (thrill) Howard and Victor (narcotic agent) Mature keeps his nose cold on the trail. Mature hangs around and discovers who howard is and gets his revenge in the end in PICKUP ALLEY.
- 4 AUG: In 1508 a guy named Pope somebody or other wanted to have a real nice cealing so he went out and hired this downtrodden homosexual painter and hired him to color up his ceiling with a nice christian painting. The painter paints the ceiling for about 600 years and one day he falls off his ladder and work slows down. Charlton Heston and sexy Remy Harrison play the painter and the nut who hires him in the very good flick entitled THE AGONY AND THE ECSTACY.
