



The tour includes admission to the FINAL MISSION: THE USS TANG EXPERIENCE!

Final Mission: The USS Tang Submarine Experience places visitors aboard the most successful submarine in World War II for its fifth and final war patrol on 25 October 1944.

Final Mission: The USS Tang Submarine Experience is both intimate and personal — accommodating 27 visitors per "patrol." Each will receive a "watch bill" representing a specific Tang crewmember and many will be "enlisted" to perform specific tasks to navigate through the battle. At the end of the experience, they will discover if they were among those lost or one of the few who, after a harrowing ordeal at sea, suffered on in Japanese captivity.

We will split our group up into smaller groups of 27 and you will be able to request a specific group at registration.


