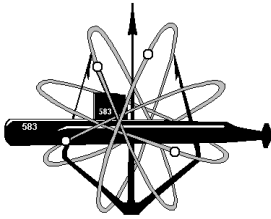

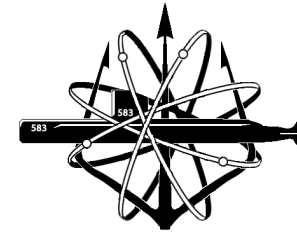

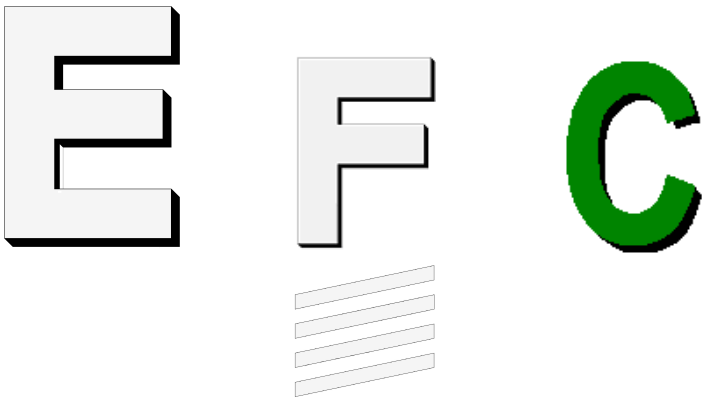

Arlington National Cemetery

Arlington National Cemetery welcomes visitors to explore the rich history found within the cemetery grounds.

Arlington National Cemetery Tours, Inc., provides an interpretative tour bus service through Arlington with weekday stops at the Ord & Weitzel walking gate to see the U.S. Marine Corps War Memorial, President John F. Kennedy gravesite, U.S. Coast Guard Memorial, U.S. Army Gen. John J. Pershing's gravesite, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, and the Arlington House (The Robert E. Lee Memorial).



GEORGE WASHINGTON'S MOUNT VERNON



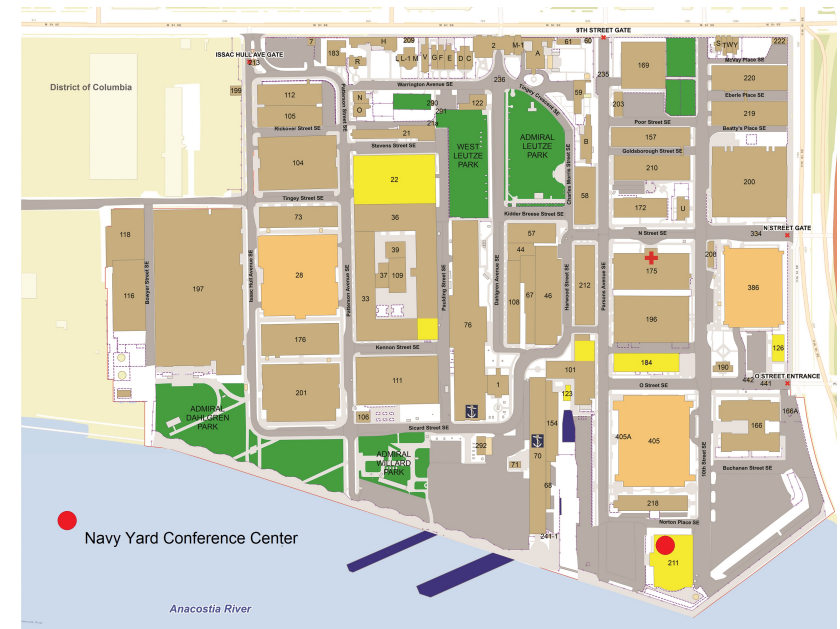
This includes a tour of the Mansion - After the death of his older half-brother, Lawrence, in 1752, George Washington took up residence at the house that his father, Augustine Washington, had built in 1734. Over the next five decades, Washington expanded the house to create an impressive 21-room mansion with vibrant wall colors, intricate architectural details, and elegant furnishings. The interiors have been meticulously restored to their appearance in 1799. Walk through the first and second floors, where history interpreters share more information about the house and its residents.



United States Navy Museum

The tour departs the Hotel in the morning and proceeds to the U.S. Navy Museum where, after a brief introduction, there will be a guided tour of the Pre-Cold War area of the Museum (Bldg 76). Following the guided tour you will have an hour or so to tour, on your own, the Cold-War area of the Museum which includes Korea, Vietnam, Cuban Missile Crisis, and the most extensive submarine exhibits (Bldg 70).

United States Navy Memorial

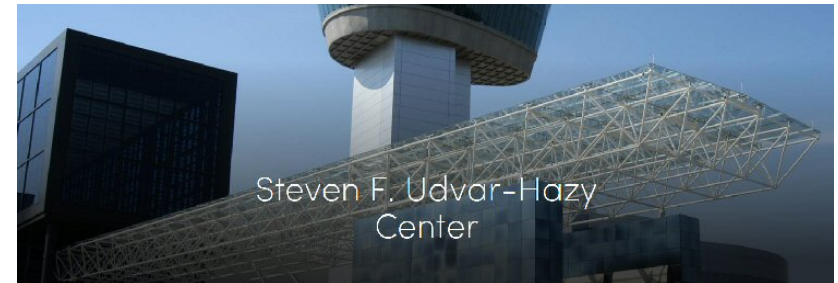


The Navy Memorial includes both a commemorative public plaza and a Naval Heritage Center. The plaza is a round ceremonial amphitheater paved in granite to form a 100-foot diameter of the world. Surrounding the deck of the plaza are fountains, pools, flagpole masts, and sculptural panels depicting historic achievements of the sea services. A symbolic statue of a Lone Sailor stands watch near the edge of the plaza.

The afternoon will be spent at the U.S. Navy Memorial for the dedication of the USS Sargo (SSN 583) plaque at the Memorial.



STEVEN F. UDVAR-HAZY CENTER



Hundreds of aircraft and spacecraft are on display in two massive hangars, including a Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird, the Boeing B-29 Superfortress Enola Gay, and the Space Shuttle Discovery. View aircraft flying in and out of Dulles International Airport from our Observation Tower. Watch restoration specialists restore artifacts in our Restoration Hangar. The cost of admission is FREE, parking at the Center is \$15.00
